Code: EL1: SS

Directions: Make copies of the bingo table for each student plus one extra. Cut the extra copy into squares and place the squares in a bowl or hat. To play, draw out a square and read it to the class. Have the students write a correct answer in the matching square. Continue drawing until a student has correct answers for the squares in a diagonal or straight line. Game may be played individually or by groups of students.
