
Cover photo

The scientific names for the seeds shown on the cover are identified by the key and photo below. Seeds 2 and 7 have had their wings removed by cleaning.

- 1. Green ash (Fraxinus pennsylvanica Marsh.)
- 2. Ponderosa pine (Pinus ponderosa P. & C. Lawson)
- 3. Northern red oak (Quercus rubra L.)
- 4. Witch hazel (Hamame lis virginiana L.)
- 5. Service berry (Amelanchier arborea (Michx. F.) Fern.)
- 6. Persimmon (Diospyros virginiana L.)
- 7. White fir (Abies concolor (Gord. & Glend.) Lindl. Ex Hildebr.)
- 8. Tulip poplar (Liriodendron tulipifera L.)
