National Wildfire PIO, NW IMT2, kale_caseyfirenet.gov, cell: 970-519-0006 until 4/22/2022. and activation of a Type II PIO to serve as an advisor to the WA SEOC JIC at Camp Murray for a period of 30 days.

Amendment 01: Increase funding by \$143,000, extend projected end date to 04/17/20, and change Project Manager to Samuel Turner. This includes extension of PIO at the WA SEOC, and IMT support to health district.

This MA replaces MA#3427EM-WA-USFS-01 and Amendment 3427EM-WA-USFS-01-01; Task ID #1509-312688 and #1509-312925 issued under 3427EM-WA.

Complexity analysis team capable of conducting an analysis of the current incident complexity and make recommendations to the Washington State executive staff on how to best structure their Unified Command Operations. Recommend using the NIMO team from USDA.

Additional Statement of Work

USFS will utilize other Federal agency and State/local resources under existing agreement, as appropriate.

If authorized by FEMA, USFS will establish a Base Camp to provide lodging, meals, and support for firefighting and command/control personnel and equipment. This will be provided in lieu of per diem and under a separate mission assignment.

-MA task orders (MATOs) may be issued by FEMA for specific requirements, personnel, location(s), date(s), and duration of assignment(s).

-Agencies will be reimbursed for all eligible expenses pursuant to 44 CFR. Supporting documentation is required for reimbursement.

-All equipment and supply purchases must be coordinated with FEMA Project Manager. If approved, documentation is necessary to ensure reimbursement.

-Activation of agency command center(s), if required, must be coordinated with FEMA as a separate MA.

-The mission assigned agency is responsible for ensuring that all activity is properly authorized, goods are received, services are provided, and that costs are reasonable and supported by documentation maintained by the respective agency.

-MAs shall be considered for closure after 180 days with no financial activity in accordance with FEMA CFO Bulletin #157.

-For MAs still operationally open, requests for additional obligations may be withheld if no invoicing, ULO Validation, or additional justification has been provided.
