Contractors shall bring and maintain the appropriate supply items necessary to adhere to the community mitigation strategies outlined in CDC, state public health authority and agency direction while working on wildfire incidents.

C.1 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- (d) Contractor Furnished Equipment, Supplies, and Personnel
- · Paper bath towels shall be managed and distributed to assure no cross contamination occurs.

C.3 MINIMUM EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS

- (a) Shower Units
- (20) Provide an outside waiting area with the minimum seating capacity of one chair per showerhead. Chairs shall be adjusted to achieve social distancing of 6 feet. Signage addressing social distancing should be in place. Ground covering and rain/shade protection (such as waterproof tents, awnings, and canopies) is not required over all chairs in waiting area due to this spacing.
 - (c) Wash basins (Sinks)

Sinks operations shall maintain 6 feet social distance between the sinks in use.

(f) Sanitation Requirements

These requirements are in addition to the sanitation requirement for the Shower Facilities Unit twice daily sanitation procedures;

- · Follow CDC guidelines for sanitizing solutions Bleach solution is 5 tablespoons (1/3 cup) per gallon of water.
 - · Chairs should be disinfected after each (person) use.
 - Outside sinks, faucets, and counters should be cleaned and disinfected after each (person) use.
 - · Entry door handles, handrails, and privacy curtains should be disinfected after each (person) use.
 - · Changing areas including seat or bench should be cleaned and disinfected after each (person) use.
 - · Shower stall and privacy curtain should be cleaned and disinfected after each (person) use.

Provide sufficient staffing to manage unit, social distancing, and constant cleaning/disinfecting.

If showers units do not have single outside access to the combined shower/dressing area the contractor shall provide a female attendant to clean the female shower areas.

Mobile Shower Facilities Units Key Supply Requirements for Responding to All Hazard Incidents during COVID-19 Pandemic

Contractors shall adhere to all Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), state health authority and other regulatory agency requirements, guidelines and direction regarding the current Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. Contractors must also comply with all agency infectious disease mitigation requirements when assigned to incidents and are required to provide all key supply items for the protection of their employees, vehicles and equipment when assigned to incidents.

Key supply items identified by the CDC and US Forest Service Medical and Public Health Advisory Team (MPHAT) that the contractor is required to provide include:

• Cloth face coverings - Cloth face coverings are recommended for use off the fire line when six feet of distance cannot be maintained, not including driving.
