

Natives Used on Brundage Ski Area Payette National Forest

2008 Accomplishments

The Payette National Forest was funded to help develop sources of native plant material for high elevation rehabilitation on the Brundage ski resort.

Buffalo Berry in cooperation with Brundage Ski Resort and the Payette National Forest identified 10 acres of high elevation ski slope that needed native vegetation restoration. Collection of native grasses, shrubs, and forbs occurred during the fall and spring of 2005-2008.

Again this year container grown plants were planted at the top of ski lifts and near access roads. Establishment is slow but most of last year plants survived.

This year more sagebrush, buckwheat, and Idaho fescue was planted.
