Rehabilitation in the Central Franciscan Ecological Subsection Six Rivers and Mendocino National Forests, Region 5

2009 Accomplishments

In 2008, seed of the perennial grass, *Elymus glaucus*, was collected from stands in the Central Franciscan Ecological Subsection. Seed was sent to J. Herbert Stone Nursery in Oregon where 20 pounds of seed, representing 2 seed lots, yielded 496 pounds of seed in year one. Year 2 yields are not yet available. The seed is in storage at J. Herbert Stone Nursery.

Suitable sites affected by fire suppression activities or where consecutive weed treatments have resulted in a downward trend of a given weed population, will be targeted for revegetation either via seed or plugs.

Monitoring of revegetated sites would occur on select sites using internal funds to ascertain the survivorship and cover of revegetation materials.
