2009 Native Plant Material Accomplishments

Grow-outs

New agricultural productions were initiated of:
Letterman's needlegrass (*Achnatherum lettermanii*),
Orcutt's brome (*Bromus orcuttianus*), California brome (*B. carinatus*), Alaska oniongrass (*Melica subulata*), mountain bunchgrass (*Festuca viridula*), blue wild rye (*Elymus glaucus*), common yarrow (*Achillea millefolium*), Oregon sunshine (*Eriophyllum lanantum*), western pearly everlasting (*Anaphalis margaritacea*), *Phacelia* sp.,
Rydberg's penstemon (*Penstemon rydbergii*), and Bald Mountain milkvetch (*Astragalus umbraticus*, **a rare plant, ORNHIC list 4)

Planting & Seeding

- Fall seeding for wildlife forage, and erosion control associated with wildfire and road maintenance
- Spring planting of ~25,000 elderberry, bitter cherry, serviceberry & alder into high-severity burn areas and gaps in timber sale areas
- aesthetics and pollinator planting of 270 silver lupine plants
- Seed was provided for 4 road decommissions, a dam removal, a mine restoration, and wildfire suppression rehabilitation.
- ~ 5 miles of storage roads were worked into linear meadows.

Seed collection

- Large wild seed collections were made of Letterman's needlegrass, long-stalked clover, yarrow, Spanish clover, *Phacelia*, big deervetch, leafy pea, red columbine, pearly everlasting, bunchberry dogwood, blue elderberry, leopard lily, and camas.
- Seeds were cleaned at Bend Seed Extractory.

Seed purchase

• Over 3,000 lbs. of grass seed (blue wild rye, Roemer's fescue, & California brome) from our locally-collected increase productions were purchased for various Forest needs.
