Native Plant Program – Planting for Pollinators The Wayne National Forest 2009 Accomplishments

2009 Native Plant Project activities included:
Planted 1,000 ft² of new pollinator gardens and 100 ft² of woodland pollinator gardens.

•Treated 3 acres of invasive plants in the Ironton District Office's weed free zone.

•Extended interpretive trails at Ironton and Athens buildings, over 0.5 mile new trail created.

•Connected plant interpretive trail to bird blind at Athens District building.

•Designed 10 signs for interpretive trails (e.g. pollinators, native plants, wildlife, prairies, landscape with nature, plant rescues, vernal pool, invasive plant prevention, forest ecology).

•Maintenance of 5,000 ft² of existing pollinator gardens.

•Grew over 5,000 native plant plugs for future restoration and pollinator garden projects.

•Used plants grown for wetland and grassland restoration on the Ironton Ranger District.

•Creation of vernal pool and interpretive sign.

• Organization of 6 volunteer plant rescues to bring local plants to Athens/SO gardens.
