## 2010 Whitebark Pine Cone Collection on the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest

## 2010 Accomplishments

This project was to collect whitebark pine cones to acquire and increase seed for future out planting on the Beaverhead-Deerlodge NF. Cones were collected from 20 trees in the Vipond Park area on the Wise River Ranger District. This is a unique area of the forest with some of the last remaining whitebark pine due to the mountain pine beetle epidemic that is occurring on the forest. Bob Hodge, Gary Hertin and Anton Brennick used a cherry picker (Figure 1) to cage the cones (Figure 2) to protect them from Clark's Nutcracker damage. Those activities occurred in July of 2010. Then in the last week of September they went out with the cherry picker and collected the cages and cones. Three bushels of cones were collected (Figure 3) and delivered to the Coeur d'Alene Nursery for grow out and increase.
