2010 Accomplishments

We are developing a long-term, Forest-wide Native Plant Program on three Ranger Districts to supply and manage native plant materials on the San Bernardino National Forest, California. We are leveraging internal partner funds as well as external partner grant funds.

- 5 acres suppression repair planting
- 100 acres prior restoration site maintenance
- 1600 pinyons containerized from seed beds
- 6130 containerized plants outplanted on forest
- Providing plants for 12 other projects
- Increase SBNF NPM Program Seed Bank • 1 acre ELEL plugs maintained at Boy's Ranch
- 80 BRCA, ELGL plugs planted Sky Forest Station
- 250 lbs of 27 native species collected and stored
