## Caribou-Targhee NF Curlew National Grassland Off-Center Plant Testing Site

2011 Accomplishments

The Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS), Aberdeen Plant Material Center (PMC) established a multi-species plant test site on the Curlew National Grassland.

The project provides an on-site opportunity to test and demonstrate the grasses, forbs and shrub species adapted to the conditions found on the Curlew NG and many other areas throughout the sagebrush steppe with similar ecological site conditions (semi-arid, big sagebrush/bluebunch wheatgrass, 12 – 25" annual precipitation).

The 200' x 180' area was disked in the fall of 2009 and subsequently sprayed in the spring and summer of 2010 with roundup®/2,4-d mix.

## In FY2011:

- •The trial was planted on November 17, 2010 using a Tye Drill with a drill width of 80 inches (8 rows at 10 inch spacing). Experimental design is a randomized complete block with 3 replications.
- •Fencing was placed around the study site by Westside District personnel in the spring 2011.
- •The NRCS measured initial plant establishment and provided a report of 1<sup>st</sup> year results.
