Integrated Restoration of High Priority Invasive Species Sites within the Western Jurassic and Central Franciscan Ecological Subsections

2011 Accomplishments

This project was initiated to partner with two local non-profit organizations to work with the Six Rivers National Forest to treat non-native invasive plants.

The Mid Klamath Watershed Council has collected 2.6 pounds of *Ceanothus integerrimus* (deerbrush) an early successional pioneer in the Western Jurassic Ecoregion Subsection. The seed will be grown out in 2012 to meet revegetation goals and objectives at nonnative, invasive plant treatment sites.

Additionally, the Mid Klamath Watershed Council and the Redwood Community Action Council, inventoried and treated 8 acres of nonnative, invasive plants on Forest.
