2012 Accomplishments



The Sula Ranger District Pollinator garden, begum in 2010, has been a wild success. Hundreds of plants that were installed last year, provided a riot of color all summer long in front of the ranger station. An interpretive panel for the garden was installed along with bee and Butterfly boxes made by local students from Trapper Creek Job Corp.

The garden was expanded this fall along the south and east sides of the building using plants from local growers and divisions of plants from other pollinator gardens on the forest. Next year the district plans to continue this expansion around the whole building.
