ART GALLERY TO SHOWCASE PAINTINGS OF FORMER LODA LAKE RESIDENT ARTIST

On Tuesday evening, May 18th, the Michigan Garden Clubs, together with the Huron-Manistee National Forests, will be hosting the opening display of the Midwestern paintings by Albert Schmidt, former resident artist at what is now the Loda Lake Wildflower Sanctuary.

Several of Mr. Schmidt's paintings have been donated to the Newaygo County Council for the Arts by his granddaughter, Karen Schmidt. The donation of paintings by Ms. Schmidt, who will be at the opening, was made in support of Loda Lake, the only wildflower sanctuary in a National Forest. The paintings will be permanently housed at the Dogwood Performing Arts Center in Fremont, Michigan and maintained by the Newaygo Arts Council.

Mr. Schmidt painted in the Hudson Valley/Impressionist style while at Loda Lake. After leaving Michigan, he relocated to New Mexico and continued painting, becoming well known as one of the Santa Fe Lost Colony Artists.
